If you receive SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program)

Crescent City Farmers Markets

Now offering unlimited SNAP match through December 31, 2020!

Purchase tokens from the Market's Welcome Tent with your Electronic Benefit Transfer card (or EBT).

Shoppers can also pre-order for drive thru, curbside pick up, and even walk up markets through the online ordering platform WhatsGood!

Top Box Foods offers SNAP matching in two ways.

- 1- Purchase a produce box and receive 50% your entire order.
- 2- Get match-for-match dollars to spend on produce when you purchase meat or seafood products.

(The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children)

Sign up for the Market Mommas Club (a breastfeeding incentive program of Crescent City Farmers Market) and receive \$80 /month for 6 months to redeem at the Crescent City Farmer's Market.

(Must be eligible for Medicaid to qualify.)

Seniors

What is the **Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program?**

- Provides low-income seniors with coupons that can be exchanged for eligible foods

What is **LA CSFP?**

- Louisiana Commodity Supplemental Food Program

Who is eligible for LA CSFP?

- Low income seniors (over 60 years of age)
- For more information: ldh.la.gov/index.cfm/page/1506

What is **Meals on Wheels?**

- A network of local home deliveries, meal distribution, and wellness checks serving seniors, particularly those in isolation.

Who is eligible for Meals on Wheels?

- Must be 60 years or older and a resident of Orleans Parish.

WIC

What is **WIC?**

- The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children

Who is eligible for WIC?

- Women who are pregnant, breastfeeding, or have already delivered.
- Infants and children up to their 5th birthday may also receive benefits

SNAP

What is **SNAP?**

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, or "food stamps"

Who is eligible for SNAP?

- SNAP qualifications vary widely depending on household. Please visit www.dcfsls.la.gov/getSNAP to see if you are eligible.
